The Nebraska Veterinary Diagnostic Center will maintain approval for the following disease programs:

Avian Influenza (IAV-A)	PCR
Classical Swine Fever (CSF)	PCR
Chronic Wasting Disease (CWD)	ELISA
Foot and Mouth Disease (FMD)	PCR
Newcastle Disease (ND)	PCR
Pseudorabies (PRV)	ELISA
Swine Influenza virus (IAV-S)	PCR (matrix)
Vesicular Stomatitis virus (VSV)	PCR, CF

NAHLN Program Staff, in consultation with representatives from VS National Animal Health Program and Policy Staff and the National Veterinary Services Laboratories, reviewed individual requests for disease agent approval and determined the following related to the Nebraska Veterinary Diagnostic Center requests:

African Swine Fever (ASF) – Accepted for approval

The Nebraska Veterinary Diagnostic Center submitted an Addendum to the Agreement for Participation in November 2018 as part of a plan to expedite preparedness for ASF. Personnel from your laboratory have successfully passed a proficiency test and received controlled-copies of the current standard operating procedures (SOPs). Therefore, the Nebraska Veterinary Diagnostic Center is officially approved to participate in the ASF disease program.
